



Commonwealth of Virginia Finalizes Northrop Grumman \$2 Billion IT Infrastructure Partnership Contract

The 10-year contract is valued at approximately \$2 billion and includes cost reimbursable, fixed-priced and fixed-unit pricing contractual provisions.
